



Who is here?

This strategy helps students learn to recognise their names and allows you to see, at a glance, who is and is not at school.

I usually set the display up just inside the classroom door. I display the chart on a board with a table set up under/in front of it on which I spread out the names of students.

As students enter the room, they find their name and place it on the chart. At the end of the day students may remove their name and place it on the table in preparation for the next day.

I usually find that two or three weeks at the beginning of the year is a suitable time frame for this activity.

This chart heading is designed for use in conjunction with other documents available from readlearn:

- *Busy Bee Find your name – poster*
- *Busy Bee Name card template*

Instructions

1. *Print this chart heading on A3 paper and attach it to the top of your display.*
2. *Print the "Find your name" poster and attach it to the display or place it on the table with the names.*
3. *Insert the name of each child in the document "Name cards". Print the names, then cut out and laminate.*

Hint: *Laminating the chart heading and poster, in addition to the name cards, will protect them for future use.*
