

Each child needs:

- one copy of the cover printed on light card
- multiple copies of the pages printed on paper (one for each statement)
- 1metre of cord or ribbon
- access to a hole punch and stapler

Introduction

Discuss the significance of Mother's Day with the children.

Write the words "My Mum" on the board.



Invite children to share special things about their Mums, beginning with the statement "My Mum". Write their ideas on the board. Suggestions include:

personalised just for her, on Mother's Day.

to showcase their developing literacy skills.

- My mum tucks me into bed at night.
- My mum reads me stories.
- My mum makes me feel better when I am sick.
- My mum goes to work
- My mum likes to watch TV.

Write: Children write a list of things that are special about their own Mums. They may write their statements in their writing books first, then edit and proofread before transcribing them onto the pages of their books. Alternatively they may write them onto the pages without pre-writing. Which you choose will depend on the children's development and available time. A statement such as "My Mum loves me and I love her" is a nice way to finish the book.

Making these gifts for their Mums provides your children with an additional opportunity

Illustrate: Children draw a picture of Mum on each page to illustrate the statement.

Compile: Arrange the pages in order. Staple the pages together with the decorated cover (refer to page 2).

Note: Printing costs can be reduced by making one heart shape and using it as a template for cutting the other pages. Alternatively, simply use sheets of A4 paper folded or cut in half.
